

The Oregon Mini Society Your Host for the 2025 MMW

The Oregon Mini Society: A Legacy of Mini Enthusiasm and Camaraderie

Car clubs are only as strong as their membership, and that has been key to the success of the Oregon Mini Society (OMS). The love for Austins and Morris Minis has long had deep roots in the Pacific Northwest. In the late 1970s and '80s. a group of Portland-area

enthusiasts-informally known as The Loose Minis-frequented the winding roads to the coast and mountains in spirited high-speed packs. Among them were notable names like Jeff Doan (motorcycle racer, machinist, and Mini devotee), Ward Barbour (former BMC mechanic and race engine builder), Jeff Drago (importer of quirky Minis like the Ranger, Popemobile, and Mini Limo), and George Thomas.

True to their name, formality wasn't a focus. They had officers and a newsletter, but most members were



young, passionate, and primarilv interested in enjoying their Minis.

One story from Jeff Doan captures their freewheeling spirit: after a beach campout, the group drove four Minis wide across the eastbound lanes of Highway 26 toward Hillsboro. When a rock from one car shattered Jeff Drago's windshield, Drago simply punched through the broken glass to clear his view. That marked the end of the four-wide stunt—but not the



end of the fun.

Eventually, life intervened-careers, families, and responsibilities led to the group's gradual fade. But in 1988, Mini owner Kathleen LaFolette envisioned a more formal club. She canvassed Mini owners at that year's Portland All British Field Meet, where a strong Mini showing (including a Mini Meet West element) helped spark the

idea. The response was overwhelmingly positive, and early meetings of a new Mini club began in 1989. Though some former Loose Minis members joined, many were new enthusiasts. After some debate over names-"Portland Minis," "Portland Mini Society," and more-Oregon Mini Society was chosen to reflect statewide reach. The club was formally incorporated as a nonprofit in 1991.

OMS quickly became a hub of activity with monthly meetings, scenic drives, car shows, and an engaged membership. One shining example of the club's spirit came during the time of member Sue Sanders. When

her Mini needed mechanical work, fellow members stepped in to help. Even as



ly battled cancer, she remained active and inspirational within the club. Today, the "Spirit of Sue" Award honors members who exemplify her commitment and courage.

A major highlight of OMS history has been its role in

hosting Mini Meet West (MMW)—the rotating annual gathering of West Coast Mini enthusiasts. OMS has proudly hosted:

1988 September 2-5 - Portland, Oregon The 14th Mini Meet West, Hosted at the All British Field Meet, Portland International Raceway.

1995 August 2-4 – The 19th Mini Meet West (aka) Meet at the Mountain (autocross at Timberline Lodge, event video by a young Eric Newland)

2001 August 7-9 – Florence, Oregon (chilly coastal BBQ)

2007 June 10-12 – The 29th Mini Meet West Hood River, Oregon

2013 June 18-20 – The 34th Mini Meet West, Bend, Oregon (snow in June at Mt. Bachelor—aka "Snow-pocalypse!")

2018 June 25-29 – The 38th Mini Meet West Hood River with the Legend Paddy Hopkirk (spectacular



car show at Sorosis Park and Maryhill hillclimb run)

Despite the occasional curveball (weather, road closures), every event has been a resounding success thanks to a dedicated core of volunteers.

The arrival of the BMW MINI in 2002 brought changes. With the 25-year federal import rule, 1967 was long the latest legal year for classic Minis. The stark contrast between 1950s Mini technology and

the modern MINI design created a clear generational divide—yet many OMS members appreciate both eras and often own one of each.

Today, OMS stands on a strong foundation built over decades of enthusiasm, friendship, and dedication. Whether it's wrenching in the garage, driving in a convoy, or organizing a major event, the Ore-

gon Mini Society continues to thrive—united by the joy these little cars bring.

The End of the Oregon Trail Interpretive Center is part of a network of museums and visitor centers along



the Oregon Trail, each offering unique interpretive

To leave the "suffocating dust" of the Columbia plateau, the travelers had two choices: by the Columbia River or overland (after 1845) on the Barlow Road.

Not too far past the end of the Barlow Road, the wagon trains camped a final time on the broad creekside meadow near the Willamette River. This spot, Oregon City's Abernethy Green, marked the traditional End of the Oregon Trail.

Mount Hood is a popular destination for outdoor enthusiasts, offering a wide range of recreational activities such as skiing, snowboarding, hiking, and climbing. The mountain is home to s Timberline Lodge, which boasts the longest ski season in North America. In addition to its natural beauty and recreational appeal, Mount Hood holds cultural signifi-

cance for Native American tribes and continues to be an important symbol of the Pacific Northwest.

Mini Meet West 2025 Autocross Event Rules

Autocross is a low speed driving skill contest. Each car is separately timed over a clearly defined forward moving course of slaloms, braking maneuvers, and obstacle avoidance. Primary emphasis is placed on driver skill along with car handling and maneuverability rather than raw power or straight-line performance. The Event occurs on an expanse of open pavement with orange safety cones defining the course.

Insurance / Liability – All individuals (participant or spectator) are responsible for repair of damage they cause to their or others people's cars or property. Drivers, be aware that MMW 2025 Insurance defines our Autocross event as a competition. Accordingly, most personal automotive insurance will not cover damages to your or other cars. Proper caution is strongly encouraged. Damage to Timing Equipment, Entrants that come into contact with any of the timing equipment (i.e., timing lights, reflectors, cables, Antennas with their vehicles are subject to a fine between \$25 --

\$250 fine to be paid before leaving the event.

Liability Waiver – All persons attending MMW 2025 hosted driving event MUST sign the Liability Waiver. For those under 18 years old, Minor Waivers must be signed by a parent/guardian and witnessed on site by a MMW 2025 member or notarized beforehand. Those who choose not to sign will not be allowed on the site.

Driver's License – All entrants must be in possession of a current and valid Driver's License. Learner's Permit and signed Waiver (if a minor).

Run Order - Car classes are scheduled to run in a particular session

Restricted Items and Activities – Alcohol, drugs and fireworks are prohibited. People in possession of these items will be disqualified and asked to leave the site, local authorities are maybe contacted. Infractions of this rule should be immediately reported to the Event Chair or safety officer.

Spectators & Guests – Competitors are responsible for the actions of their guests. Spectators behaving inappropriately will be expelled from the event at the discretion of the Event Chair.

Speed Limits – General site speed is 10 MPH and limit in the Pit area is 5 MPH. Violators are subject to disciplinary action from verbal warning to disqualification and expulsion. Anyone driving dangerous or intentionally unsafe manner on or off course will be disqualified and expelled from the event pending a ruling by the Event Chair.

Helmets – All competitors and passengers must have an appropriate helmet. An appropriate helmet is defined as the three most current Snell 2010/2015/2020 revisions with a rating of Snell K, M, or SA. All helmets must be approved by vehicle tech inspection. Drivers of vehicles lacking a windscreen must have a full face helmet, goggles or other adequate eye protection.

Vehicle Inspection - All vehicles must pass a safety inspection prior to driving on the course and have a tech sticker on the windscreen.

Seat Belts – Seat Belts with metal – to – metal buckle required for driver and passenger seats. When not occupied, passenger seat belt should be secured when practical. Aftermarket shoulder harnesses or other auxiliary belts will not be worn in open top

vehicles without roll bars installed.

Runs – The goal is for competitors will get three official timed runs. The fastest timed run including penalties will be counted for scoring and class ranking. If you see a "RED" flag on the course, come to a safe stop immediately. Remain stopped until given instructions by course workers.

Grid – No pets, scooters, bicycles, skateboard, running in grid, or unescorted children (under 10). No smoking in grid.

Penalties – **Cones** - Two seconds will be added to the official run time for each cone(s) displaced. A cone is consider displaced if is knocked over on its side or moved completely outside the box marking its original position. Displaced pointer cones do not count as a penalty.

Penalties – **Gates** – Ten seconds will be added to the official run time for each gate missed. A gate penalty is assessed when a car deviates from the intended course as follows: - The car is driven completely around a 2-cone gate. Note: one set of tires passing through the gate and displacing one cone will be assessed as a cone penalty. One gate penalty will be assessed for each slalom cone skipped or passed on the incorrect side. Failure to drive on the side of a cone opposite of the pointer cone.

Penalties – Did Not Finish (DNF) – A single run will be scored a DNF when a participant does any of the following: Does not complete his/her run. – Incurs too many penalties – Makes course deviations that endangers people or property – Hits the timing equipment – Exits the paved surface (you will need to have your car reinspected if off pavement)

Work Assignments – All competitors must complete a work assignment if requested be event staff. Entrants who fail to complete a work assignment during the event will forfeit trophy points.


